

VX #1 in quality again

For the third year in a row, Virgin America came in first in the Airline Quality Rating report, an annual study of U.S. domestic airline performance conducted by professors at Wichita State University and Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University. Based on data all carriers must submit to the U.S. Department of Transportation, the AQR ranks airlines based on-time performance, customer complaints, denied boarding and mishandled bags. Virgin was up against 13 other major carriers and has led the industry every year since it became eligible. (To be eligible, a carrier has to make up at least 1 percent of domestic scheduled-service revenue.)


"To be recognized for the third consecutive year as the leading carrier in the Airline Quality Report is an honor and a testament to our guest-focused Teammates, both on the front-line and behind-the-scenes," said Virgin America's Chief Operating Officer, Steve Forte. Writing to Virgin teammates, Forte said, "This latest result is a great achievement for our young airline and a terrific credit to your attention to detail across every inch of our operation."

"Even with the operational challenges we faced in 2014 – including runway construction at our SFO homebase during the peak summer travel season – this team never lost sight of our operational goals."

Lynne Enderson is first SFO GST to retire

Lynne Enderson, a GST at SFO since January 2008, will be retiring this month after seven years with Virgin America. She originally came to VX hoping for "a fun retirement job" after a career with the phone company and other employers.


Lynne said that once she stops working, she hopes to finish some projects and start some new ones, in addition to the usual desire to spend more times with family and friends.

As an official Virgin retiree, Lynne will be eligible for unlimited travel on Virgin America with an SA3 status, along with a spouse or other eligible traveling companion.

The Virgin America retirement program (for employees who are under age 55 as of April 1, 2012) allows employees to retire and participate in the program if their work service is at least 10 years, and their years of service and their age equals 65. For example, a new 35-year-old teammate would need to work 15 years before being eligible to retire (15 years plus age 50 equals 65). A new 45-year-old teammate would need to work 10 years (10 years plus age 55 equals 65.)


For employees over age 55 before April 1, 2012, the employee needed to work at least five years, and the years of service and age had to reach 70.

Retirees also have to pay \$120 per year to participate in the system, which also allows travel on other airlines with which Virgin America has a reciprocal agreement.


